Executive Leadership Program Class of 2024

The Allstate Foundation Executive Leadership Program is accepting applications from highly motivated nonprofit professionals who want to take their leadership skills to the next level.

Created in partnership with the Northwestern University Kellogg School of Management's Center for Nonprofit Management, the Executive Leadership Program provides a combination of cohort-based academic instruction and executive coaching. All program elements are funded by The Allstate Foundation.

Leaders emerge from the Executive Leadership Program positioned to further transform their organizations, their communities and the nonprofit sector.

About The Allstate Foundation Executive Leadership Program

The Kellogg School Center for Nonprofit Management has designed an academic program to address topics that are essential to enhancing your leadership skills and building your capacity to effectively lead diverse, engaged teams in fulfillment of your mission.

During the Executive Leadership Program, you will explore leadership and management topics that fall under three categories: Organizational Leadership & Personal Growth, Nonprofit Management and Building Your Executive Toolkit.

Potential sessions may include Understanding Organizational Culture, Leading Change, Internal Inclusion for Effective Outward Leadership, Nonprofit Board Governance, Executive Presence, and Crisis Communications and Strategic Stakeholder Management.

In addition to the academic sessions, participants engage in:

- **Hogan Leadership Forecast Series:** The Hogan assessments help individuals by facilitating strategic self-awareness and building an understanding of their work style traits, core values and derailment risks.
- **One-on-One Executive Coaching:** Participants are matched with executive coaches who guide them toward their professional development and leadership goals.

Commitment of Resources and Time

The Executive Leadership Program includes three sessions. Each session is three days long and takes place in Chicago. Full program attendance is mandatory, and program and travel expenses are fully covered by The Allstate Foundation.

Application and Selection

To apply, visit allstatefoundation.org/nonprofitleadership. The application will ask you about your current role and organization, as well as your professional leadership experience and eligibility criteria. The Allstate Foundation will review candidates and select 30 participants in September in advance of the program starting in October 2023.

To ensure as many organizations as possible benefit from the Executive Leadership Program, the program does not admit participants from the same organization in consecutive years. Program Eligibility

Qualified candidates for the program have:

- More than 10 years of professional experience.
- More than three years of experience in the nonprofit sector.
- More than five years of experience in a leadership role, whether that's formally leading a team or leading a project, workstream, associate board, etc.

Priority consideration will be given to leaders:

- Who are looking to advance in their career and grow their impact.
- Who've demonstrated a commitment to advancing diversity, equity and inclusion.
- From nonprofits with annual budgets from \$1 million to \$20 million.
- From nonprofits within The Allstate Foundation's focus areas of youth empowerment, relationship abuse and racial equity / workforce development.
- Living in the United States.
